DID YOU KNOW?

Everyone has their favorite ball marker, whether it's a coin, lucky penny, a casino chip, or a marker from their favorite course, but did you know... that using a leaf, twig or any natural material will result in a penalty stroke? In 1952, the USGA agreed to allow golfers to mark their ball with a golf marker. Until that time, golfers had to putt around another golfer's ball if it was in their direct line to the cup. The golf ball marker, according to the rules, must be artificially made... and now you know.

SGL TIP OF THE WEEK

Last Saturday, the SGL Board met to discuss the state of the league, miscellaneous league business and two rule proposals that you need to know about. The two rules were voted on and passed and are effective immediately.

Fairway Divot Rule:

If a ball comes to lie in a divot <u>in the fairway</u>, the ball may be picked up and the divot repaired, and the ball placed back in the repaired divot. (Decision by playing partners)

To repair the divot, the following applies:

- 1. Fill the divot with sand provided by the course.
- 2. The sand must be packed down to being level with the ground (below the grass line).a.) The sand cannot be piled into a mound allowing the ball to be teed up above the grass line.
- 3. The ball will be <u>placed</u> back in the repaired divot.
- 4. If no sand is available, with group approval, the player can move the ball within 12 inches of the divot no closer to the hole.
- 5. Anytime a player creates a divot, that player should repair the divot with sand provided by the course.

Bunker Repair Rule:

If a ball is hit into a bunker and comes to rest in a disturbed area, the player may mark the area where their ball came to rest, pick their ball up, rake the disturbed area and place their ball back in the original spot where their ball came to rest. (Decision by playing partners)

- 1. A disturbed area is a footprint and/or divot created by another player.
- 2. This rule does not apply when the ball comes to rest in a disturbed area created by the same player who hit their ball into the bunker. An example would be when a player's first bunker shot is unsuccessful and the balls rolls back into their own divot or footprint.

Feel free to touch base with any of the board members for clarification on the above rules. Again, these new rules are effective immediately.


JIM BIELENIEWICZ was the Flight #1 Champion. Jim shot a 73 net on Saturday. Congratulation Jim!!
